- ★ Our Sensory room is gradually being established. It should be fully complete and functional by the start of Term 3.
- ★ Our Learning Enrichment Hub continues to grow in supporting the teaching and learning of the classrooms. Our Year 1/2 students are shining in their learning growth, skill development and consolidation of essential skills and learning processes.
- ★ Our STEAM classes are continuing to shine with their projects and learning activities. With fashion hats, self propelling boats, robot designs, rockets reaching new heights, self growing flowers and a whole lot more, STEAM has become a favourite with students as they apply their learning skills to solving real world problems and projects.
