## Preparing for 2019

### *Enrolments*

### *Communications strategy*

BCCS has a strong commitment to becoming a more sustainable school. Helping our children to understand the impact their actions have on their environment is very important, but becoming role models and leading the change are essential for our students to fully grasp a more sustainable world in the future.

In 2019, going paperless is an integral step in our school's sustainability program. The steps taken to become a green school also saves our staff time and is very budget friendly. Reducing paper costs, printing costs and time spent printing/assembling/distributing has been proven time and again to be a significant help for all schools. To do this from 2019 our fortnightly paper newsletter provided to all families will move to a pdf version available online. To reduce the number of notes coming home (and getting lost!) we will increase our use of uEducateUs, for event notifications, permission forms, reminders and important dates.

Alana, throughout Term 4, will be prioritising contacting families who are struggling to connect into uEducateUs and provide support and assistance, to ensure that we are all ready for 2019. Emails and Facebook will continue to be our Newsfeed and community announcement processes.

## Uniform

In response to many community members making comment about BCCS uniform, we are in the process of making some changes. I am very appreciative of Carolyn Betts, and other members of the P & F, who has done a lot of investigating and research on updating our uniform and supporting my thinking to adjust to the context of our area.

### 2019 will see the following uniform changes:

**Year 6 shirt:** current year 5 students will have the opportunity to design a year 6 polo shirt that they can wear as an alternate shirt to the school shirt. This will be an additional cost for our Year 6 parents, however, it is about developing a ceremony and initiation in recognising our Year 6 students transitioning from childhood to youth hood.

**School Shirts:** we are still awaiting a sample shirt to confirm design and colour base, the current discussion is based around a mid/royal blue, with maroon panels and light grey trimming. Once we have a sample we will be able to be more specific.

**Girls Uniform:** Culottes are being replaced with a Midnight Navy Skort.



This can be worn all year round with Navy Blue **tights** underneath. Families and Girls who still wish to wear the existing winter uniform can continue to wear it until stocks run out.

**Boys Uniform:** remains with the current structure of navy blue shorts being worn all year or moving to the long pants during winter.

**Still being reviewed:** sport short material and style, shoes guidelines.

These students placed either 1<sup>st</sup> or 2<sup>nd</sup> in the Mitchell Cluster Athletics day to qualify. All students competed well and some very good results were achieved. Some of the more notable results were: Kye Alkemade, who is one of our newest students, came 1<sup>st</sup> in the 1500m, Izaak Taylor placed 2<sup>nd</sup> in long jump, Gabby Scollary placed 2<sup>nd</sup> in shot put, Cody Stephens was also 2<sup>nd</sup> in high jump, Copper Hutton was 3<sup>rd</sup> in shot put and one of the biggest achievements was Callum Clay who placed equal 3<sup>rd</sup> in shot put. Congratulations to all who competed at this level.

All students who placed 1<sup>st</sup> or 2<sup>nd</sup> qualified for the Division Athletics which was held on the 10<sup>th</sup> of September.
